Playground Grant: I want to give a shout out to our fabulous Park Board! Because of their efforts and the generosity of our citizens, we exceeded our goal for the shade structure. With this goal achieved, they have now turned their focus on applying for a grant in October of this year in hopes of upgrading other playground equipment to make DWG the best it can be. Be on the lookout for information about surveys to gain citizen feedback in advance of applying for the grant.

Budget Process: We will begin budget work sessions in July for the 2021-2022 budget year. City Council is looking to pursue a one million dollar bond for streets as previously authorized by a majority vote of citizens at a previous election. We're also working on capital improvement plans to get the city on a regular schedule for street improvements and potentially address drainage concerns.

Irrigation Restrictions: We want to remind you of city ordinance requirements for irrigation. Lawns and landscaping may be watered on any day, at any time, by handheld hose, drip irrigation, a soaker hose or tree bubbler. Except for hand watering, drip irrigation and the use of soaker hoses, a person may only irrigate, water, or cause or permit the irrigation of watering of any lawn or landscape, inclusive of structural foundations, trees, and other high value landscape materials, located on premises owned, leased, or managed by that person:

- (A) On a day designated as an outdoor water use day for the property's address as shown below; and
- (B) Between the hours of 12:00 midnight to 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 11:59 p.m. on such day.
 - (i) Residential addresses ending in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6 or 8) may water on Wednesdays and Saturdays.
 - (ii) Residential addresses ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7 or 9) may water on Thursdays and Sundays.
 - (iii) All nonresidential locations (apartment complexes, businesses, industries, parks, street and/or roadway medians, etc.) may water on Tuesdays and Fridays.





If you currently have a brick mailbox it is likely that a locking mailbox can be retrofitted into your existing brick mailbox. It is a great peace of mind to know your mail is protected in your mailbox until you are able to check it.
